## **Background**

Violence against women is a serious and widespread problem in Australia, with enormous individual and community impacts and social and financial costs

#### Goals

The ARC project seeks to challenge underlying beliefs, attitudes and social systems that enable violence in our families and communities

## **Frameworks**

- Gender transformative approaches
- Intersectional feminist framework

## **Activities**

"Thank you for supporting communities to rethink gendered experiences of violence and how we as individuals can initiate change within our own lives and communities"

ARC Gender Relations is a multi-tiered project, and has involved

- 1. Sector development and training
- 2. Communities of practice
- 3. Groups for men including a Dad's Group and a group for men who have caused harm
- 4. Community development project that engages male identified people to support them to work as allies in the community
- 5. Organisational development

#### **Outcomes**

"For me it has changed the language that I use, how I communicate in challenging conversations, day to day conversations, with colleagues, pretty much across the board"

- Facilitating men to engage in a process of self-reflection regarding gender stereotypes, accountability, safety, power, privilege and entitlement
- Increasing participants' knowledge about gender stereotypes, gender equity, respectful relationships and violence as an expression of masculinity
- Empowering community participants to be change agents
- Supporting men to engage with other men in the community to foster better understanding of gender stereotypes and gender equity
- Increasing levels of understanding of sector professionals about how stereotypical gender relations impact the workplace and ways to work effectively with men
- Increasing sector knowledge about integrating gender transformative approaches into professional settings
